**Planned Palm Beach North Sportsplex
Names U.S. #1 in Orthopedics, HSS,
to be Official Hospital**

17-Acre Nonprofit Sports Complex Guided by Acclaimed Athletes, Business, Community Leaders

Palm Beach Gardens, FL, January 15, 2020 – The Palm Beach North Athletic Foundation (PBNAF) today announced that the 200,000-plus-square-foot, state-of-the-art in-door recreation complex it is developing in Palm Beach Gardens will have as its official hospital HSS, ranked US #1 in orthopedics for the past 10 years. PBNAF is a non-profit organization, whose advisors include Olympians Mike Eruzione and Rachel Mayer Godino, and Brian Seymour, co-chair of Gunster’s Real Property law practice. The multi-sport Palm Beach North Sportsplex is slated to open in late 2022.

As the official Hospital of the Palm Beach North Sportsplex, HSS will provide education and care to support better wellness, performance, injury prevention, and treatment when necessary. This will take the form of materials, seminars, training and access to specialist expertise.

HSS is the world’s leading academic medical center focused on musculoskeletal health, and has been advancing the field for nearly 160 years. Headquartered at Hospital for Special Surgery in New York City and with new locations in West Palm Beach and Wellington, Florida, HSS physicians and trainers treat athletes from more than 80 of the highest performing teams in the world. PBNAF is a nonprofit organization created to develop Palm Beach North Sportsplex, a world-class community recreation facility to provide people of all ages with sports and social team-building activities critical to the development of healthy communities. PBNAF, in collaboration with the City of Palm Beach Gardens and Palm Beach County, and with support from a number of acclaimed leaders in sports, public service and business, was co-founded in 2017 by Michael Winter and Russel Dise, president of JetLease Palm Beach. This regional facility is being developed on approximately 17 acres located in the Gardens North County District Park in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida. It will include six regulation basketball courts, six regulation volleyball courts, six squash courts, two NHL regulation ice rinks, a fitness center, a sports medicine and wellness center, restaurant, and retail offerings.
